The New Longmeadow High School

The \$78 million-dollar project of Longmeadow's new high school is due for completion in February of 2013, bringing many improvements from the old school. The new high school is "going green" and uses solar energy, which will save resources and money.

The high school suffered a small fire during the construction period costing thousands of dollars worth of insulation, though no injuries were sustained.

The project seems to be on budget with \$44 Million dollars coming from the taxpayers and the state supplying the rest of the money.

Some tax payers felt opposed to the new school. They believed it was too expensive for the current economy and that the old school should have been



renovated. The project was approved because the state would reimburse so much of the cost.

The school will highlight new state of the art computer and science labs and much more. The formal opening ceremony will be September 6th of 2013 and the school should be open for the 2013-14 school year.
